PRE-ANESTHETIC BLOODWORK

To verify your pet is a healthy surgical candidate



PAIN MANAGEMENT

To provide maximum comfort pre and post operation



MEDICAL MANAGEMENT

Catheter placement, fluid therapy, anesthesia monitoring





1:1 OBSERVATION

Supervised care with a technician from start to finish.







FOLLOW-UP CALL

Personal phone call to check on your pet the next day.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT TO SPAY YOUR PET

Spaying, also called an ovariohysterectomy, involves removing both the ovaries and the uterus. Female pets that aren't spayed are at higher risk for uterine infections and mammary gland tumors, which can grow rapidly if untreated. Spaying your dog eliminates the risk of these serious health issues.
